SAFE AND CARING SCHOOLS

Our schools strive to be places where all students, staff and parents feel welcome. Our Division has administrative procedures outlining the division’s policy on student behavior and staff discipline procedures. These are located in Administrative Procedures # 310-314 and can be found on the division’s web site.

Each school has student behavior expectations specific to the needs of that school to ensure a safe and caring environment. These expectations are listed on the school’s website and are posted in classrooms. Expectations are shared with students at the beginning of each month throughout the year and are also shared with parents so we can work together to provide all students with the best possible educational experience while in our school.

St. Elizabeth also offers the P.L.A.Y. program, virtue visits and classroom buddies. All of these initiatives provide the opportunity for our older students to mentor and act as good role models for our younger students and to build relationships with one another. We have a zero tolerance for bullying and are diligent in dealing with all concerns brought forward.

Red Deer Catholic Regional School Division is committed to using the LIFE Framework as a guideline for the creation and operation of student groups that are comprehensive in their approach to inclusion and open to the exploration, in a Catholic context, of a variety of issues including bullying, sexual harassment, sexual orientation, gender identity, discrimination, justice, and respectful relationships and language. The LIFE Framework is the result of a provincial collaboration of Catholic school jurisdictions. Each of our schools may be organizing LIFE Framework/Diversity groups. INTEGRATED RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

All students at St. Elizabeth Seton School are expected to participate in the religious education programs, in addition to Religious Education classes, liturgies and masses that are held throughout the year. St. Elizabeth Seton is a part of the St. Mary's Parish Community where children celebrate friendship with Jesus in the sacrament of the Eucharist and living as a Christian within the Church community through the sacrament of Reconciliation. GENERAL INFORMATION

SCHOOL FEES

COLD WEATHER

It is important for children to have opportunities to go outside and be physically active. With the weather being so unpredictable, please dress your children appropriately for our changing Alberta weather. When the temperature drops below -20, including the wind chill, students stay indoors.

ATTENDANCE/STUDENT INFORMATION

Regular attendance is mandatory for all students. The parent or guardian must excuse each absence. Please make every attempt to have your child at school. **IF FOR ANY REASON YOUR CHILD/CHILDREN ARE GOING TO BE LATE OR ABSENT, PLEASE CALL US AT 403-343-6017.** If your child is absent and the school has not been notified, you will receive an automated phone call from the school.

Student files are updated on an ongoing basis. Please notify the school immediately if you have a change of address, home/work/cellular phone numbers, changes to emergency contact information or email address.

CRISIS RESPONSE PROCEDURES

Red Deer Catholic Regional Schools has implemented a School Division Safety Plan to create and maintain safe and caring schools. This plan includes a Crisis Response Manual, which outlines procedures and guidelines for managing a critical incident as well as regular fire drills, Hold and Secure, Shelter in Place, and Emergency Lock Downs. Staff is trained in these procedures and practices occur periodically throughout the year for students and staff to ensure we are able to deal with a critical incident in a safe and effective manner. Our school is also equipped with an AED (Automated External Defibrillator).

MEDICAL CONCERNS

Please inform the school of any medical concerns. Medical concerns and accidents of a serious nature will be reported to parents immediately. Medication will **not** be administered to students without written consent from a family doctor AND parents signing a release form. Please ensure that if your child requires a medical alert bracelet or necklace that they wear it daily.

SCHOOL PARKING LOT

In the interest of your child's safety, the school parking lot is OUT OF BOUNDS to all students at all times. Parents dropping off or picking up students should do so on Anders Street in the designated area.

DRESS CODE

At St. Elizabeth Seton School, we promote and enforce modest dress for grades Pre-K to Grade 5. Students are expected to dress modestly. Clothing is to be appropriate and respectful for the classroom. The following guidelines apply:

- ☐ Shirts that can be tucked in (no midriff showing) and no slogans that are deemed inappropriate for a Catholic school.
- ☐ Caps and hats are not allowed in school or at school functions.
- ☐ Shirts or tops must completely cover the shoulders and the back is not to be exposed; no spaghetti straps
- ☐ Shorts and skirts must be mid-thigh or longer.
- ☐ Students should not have any undergarments visible at any time; top or bottom.
- ☐ Students that do not comply with this dress code will be asked to change or call their parents to bring appropriate clothing.

All students are asked to have a pair of inside shoes and a pair of outside shoes. This contributes greatly to the cleanliness of our school.

In order to be positive role models for your children and our students, we also ask parents to please dress modestly when visiting our school.

BICYCLES & SCOOTERS

If your child brings a bicycle to school it must be placed in a bike rack and locked. No bikes are to be ridden on the school grounds. Bikes must be walked from the street to the bike rack. The school personnel cannot supervise the bike rack area continuously; therefore, the school cannot guarantee the security of the bike rack.

PARENTS

SCHOOL COUNCIL

School Council consists of parents, staff members and the school principal. School Council elections take place in September. The purpose of parental involvement is to assist in and contribute to enhancing the school environment. The Council meets once per month and all parents are welcome to attend the meetings. We look forward to your involvement in making St. Elizabeth Seton a fantastic school.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Parent involvement is supported and encouraged. Research indicates that such involvement in the education process assists in increased student achievement and success. There are many opportunities for parents to play a significant role in their child's education. We would like to hear from you if you are interested in volunteering. All volunteers require a Criminal Record Check. These are valid for 3 years. Involvement is encouraged in ANY of the following areas:

1. Being a reading role model for your child and promoting a positive attitude about reading,
2. Attending school functions,
3. Providing a supportive learning environment at home,
4. Volunteering for work committees and projects,
5. Providing supplementary learning activities at home,
6. School Council involvement,
7. Providing positive support and good public relations for the school, and
8. Communicating frequently and openly with the school.

We realize that the personal lives of families are different and that degrees of involvement at the school by parents are dependent on many factors. Your support in open communication with us and in providing your child with a good learning environment at home is extremely important for student success. If you would like to volunteer in your child's class, please contact the home room teacher. We are gracious for any support you can give us by volunteering your time for committees, projects or attending activities at the school.
